#### February SNA Meeting

### Crime Up and Down in District; Three Planning Efforts to Influence Neighborhood for Years to Come

The Sunnyside Neighborhood Association met February 25 and welcomed Ric Lopez as its new Vice-President, filling out the term of Rita Evans. Ric's term will run through February 2004, when election for all offices will be held.

#### Police Report

Captain Kevin Dillon of Ingleside Police Station began his update on local crime activity by noting that the district has seen a big drop in burglaries and robberies. Homicide is up, but most cases are drug-related. Rape also is up, with most cases involving domestic situations, not strangers. Certainly the most sensational incident was an investigation of possible child endangerment that led to the police seizing drugs and a rocket launcher from a home in the 100 block of Monterey earlier this year.

Capt. Dillon said that anyone who wishes to review the database of registered sex offenders under Megan's Law should make an appointment with the Sex Offenders Office at 880 Bryant St.

Neighbors objected to the state contractors board running a two-day sting operation out of a house across the street from Sunnyside Elementary School since this effort to catch unlicensed contractors found several with outstanding felony warrants. Capt. Dillon said that the state board had not notified SFPD of their plans and agreed that it should not have happened in close proximity to schoolchildren.

In response to concerns about increased criminal activity in the 300 block of Mangels and 400 block of Flood, Capt. Dillon encouraged neighbors to contact the SFPD for assistance in setting up a neighborhood watch program. (See page 4 for more information.)

#### Neighbor Planning Efforts

**Better Neighborhoods** – SNA Secretary Bill Wilson reported that the Better Neighborhoods draft plan for the Balboa Park BART Station Area was presented to the Planning Commission on March 6 for informational purposes. # Prestigious Award Recognizes Outstanding CC Library Services

**Balboa Park** – The Recreation and Parks Dept. is developing a master plan for Balboa Park. Two of the three draft plans assume that the park's pool *will close* once a deal is worked out with City College for public access to a new pool CC plans to build as part of a new Health and Wellness Center. Contact Mary Tienken, 581-2561, for information about the Balboa Park Master Plan.

The New Mission Terrace Improvement Assn. has been closely watching developments regarding the Balboa Park pool. If you swim at Balboa Park's pool and don't want to see it close, contact association Vice-President David Hooper at 585-0472.

City College of San Francisco – CC hosted a community meeting in January to unveil its draft master facilities plan. Of particular interest to Sunnyside neighbors were the emphasis on improving traffic flow and making reservoir parking more accessible and appealing to students, plans for a performing arts center along Phelan Avenue, and a

new Health and Wellness Center with facilities open to the public.

Of particular concern was talk of building on the Judson Hillside. SNA will write a letter to CC expressing its opposition to construction on the hillside. For a more complete report of this meeting, contact Rita Evans, 587-6234.


